District 11 is looking forward to hosting the TCAAA Bay Fishing Tournament. TCAAA participants will fish with District 11 agent boat owners and our boat owning friends who are volunteering their boats and fishing expertise. We will fish for reds, trout and flounder in the shallow waters of the Bay around Corpus Christi, Texas.

The number of guests on each boat will vary from 3 to 4, depending on the size of the boat. Boat assignments, tournament details, tackle recommendations, what to bring, meeting times, maps, etc. will be mailed to all registrants ahead of time.

We ask participants to pay the boat captain for the gas used by each boat and to have bait.

Boat space is limited, and slots will be filled in the order registrations are received. Every effort will be made to accommodate all who wish to participate. However, if registrations exceed the capacity of our volunteer boats, refunds will be issued to those at the end of the list.

Note that this tournament is being held on Saturday prior to our traditional Sunday arrival day. Be sure to plan to travel to the Coast accordingly.

Rules

1. Participants must be licensed to fish in the coastal waters of Texas. This includes having a valid fishing license and salt water stamp.
2. Participants must adhere to all Texas Parks and Wildlife rules and regulations.
3. All fish submitted for weigh-in must be of legal size and caught by the angler.
4. In accordance with state regulations, oversize redfish and trout will be allowed.
5. All participants must be registered for the tournament with TCAAA. Volunteer boat captains are eligible for all prizes. Professional fishing guides are prohibited.
6. Fishermen please take up a collection and pick up your boat captain's gas and to help with bait.

Prizes

Largest redfish, trout and flounder; Team Award- largest total stringer (total weight of stringer ÷ number of fishermen on boat)

What to Bring

We will be fishing in a remote area of the Bay. July on the bay can be extremely hot. A light colored, long sleeved shirt, hat/cap & sunglasses are advised. Also use plenty of sun screen, and stay hydrated. Be sure to bring: fishing license including a salt water stamp (**purchase license ahead of time, as they are not available at Marker 37**), fishing tackle (bring your own if possible) and wade shoes & stringer (if you like to wade). Some will want to wade, some will not, we will pair you up with others of similar preference. Medium to light tackle is appropriate. Most use artificial lures but natural bait is allowed. **Optional:** cell phone in Ziploc, portable GPS unit.

What will be Provided

Life jackets, fishing tackle (if you don't have tackle, don't worry, communicate with us ahead of time and we will provide tackle for you, give us your preference of type of reel). We will provide ice chest, ice and drinks.

Know the Limits

Limits: Reds-3, 20"-28", 1 oversize with tag/year; Flounder-2, >22" and up"; Trout-5, 15"-25, 1 oversize/day.
Know the regs and expect to be checked by the game warden!

The game of golf was born on rugged, wind-swept land similar to the coastline of Mustang Island. Every hole, every hazard, every shot at Palmilla Beach Golf Club was meticulously considered to take full advantage of the land and elements indigenous to the area. As the elements change, so does the course. It's all part of this great game as it was meant to be played. Creativity quickly becomes an asset as you face multiple options on nearly every shot. Consistent with the traditions of links golf, controlling ball trajectory and adjusting to varying slopes and conditions is more important than raw power.

Measuring over 6,900 yards from the back tees, our par 71 golf course meanders through sweeping untamed native dunes and offers spectacular views of both the Gulf of Mexico and Corpus Christi Bay. Reminiscent of the coastal links in Scotland, Palmilla Beach challenges golfers with ocean breezes, rolling fairways lined with native grasses and imposing greens. The intentional design and layout combine with the natural elements to uncover a new golf experience each time you play.

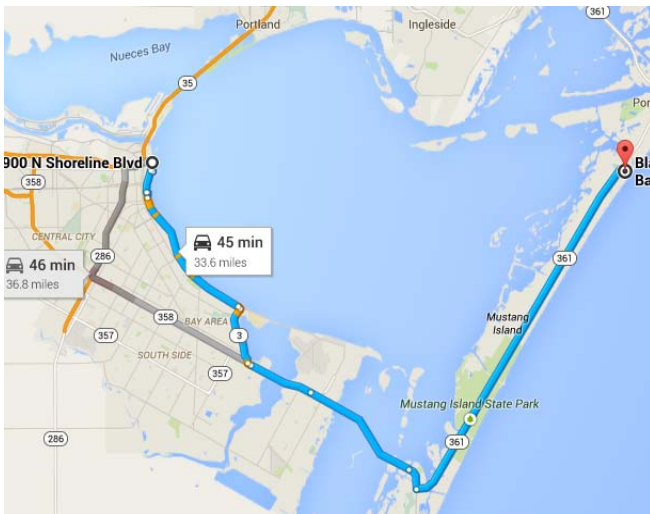

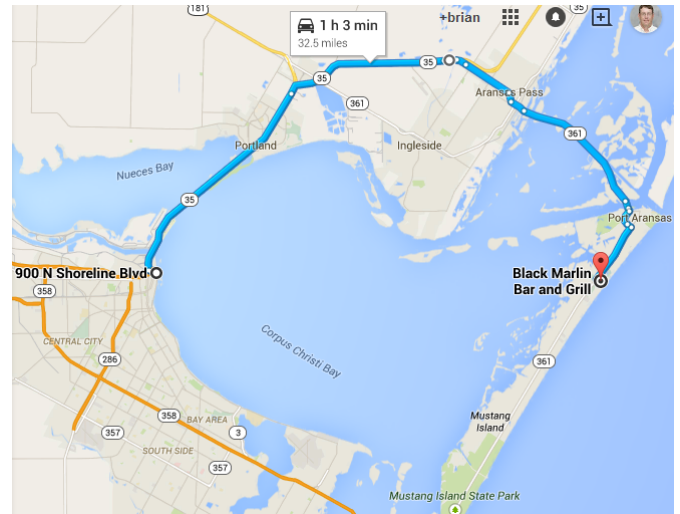
Below are two routes by automobile. You could also take your boat!

This route is the quickest at 33 miles. Take Twig St to N Shoreline Blvd (436 ft) Take Ocean Dr, TX 358-E, John F Kennedy Memorial Causeway and TX-361 N to Access Rd 1 in Port Aransas (33.3 mi) Continue to Access Rd 1 to your destination

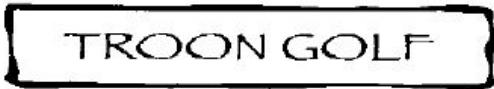

900 N Shoreline Blvd, Corpus Christi, TX 78401

This route includes a ferry. This route is the shortest at 32 miles but it depends on your wait at the ferry landing. Get on TX-35 N/US-181 N from N Shoreline Blvd. (0.6 mi) Follow TX-35 N to TX-35 BUS N/W Wheeler Ave. Take the TX-35 BUS exit from TX-35N (18.5 mi) Continue on W Wheeler Ave. Take TX-361 S to Aransas Pass—Port Aransas (9.2 mi). Take the Aransas Pass—Port Aransas Ferry. Take Cut-Off Rd and TX-361 S to your destination (3.8 mi)

Tournament Rules

1. Tournament begins at 2:00pm
2. Each player will receive \$100 in chips with their entry fee.
3. Players will be divided equally at playing tables. Players will draw for seat number and table number before tournament starts.
4. Players are responsible for dealing at their table. The deal will move clockwise around table.
5. Any over-turned card must be shown to all players at table.
6. Miss-deal can be called by any player at the table if a card is exposed or the hand is dealt improperly.
7. Cards speak for themselves regardless of the hand called by the player.
8. Blinds will start at \$5.00/\$10.00 and double every fifteen minutes.
9. One winner from each table will advance to the final table. The final tables' players will be issued playing money. Final table blinds will start at \$25.00/\$50.00 and double every fifteen minutes. If game is running late we reserve the right to increase blinds as needed.
10. Payout will be 50% -30% -20% of the purse.
