Andrew Wilson Scott Jr. was born in Fort Worth Texas to Andy and Mary Scott. Bill Wight is a fourth-generation rancher whose family has roots in the Permian Basin going back to the late 1800's. Bill has a commercial cow-calf and stocker




operation headquartered in Odessa that operates in several surrounding counties. He is also a partner in YT Ranch, the family's ranching operation. He has two children and four grandchildren.
